

A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Please scan the QR Code to sign up for FOOD DONATIONS.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time BEFORE the WEDNESDAY preceding the SECOND THURSDAY of the month.

PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin ON THAT WEDNESDAY BY 7:30am to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to SERVE the FHC lunch on that SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and cleanup. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer.

The next donation date is WEDNESDAY, December 11, for the lunch that will be served on THURSDAY, December 12.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of NON-PERISHABLES are always welcome and may be put in the Bell Tower bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.

A reminder as we approach the end of the year!

For those over the age of 70¹/₂, you have a unique opportunity to make a significant impact while also benefiting from potential tax advantages through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). A QCD allows individuals age 70¹/₂ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, **such as our parish**, <u>tax-free</u>. <u>Here are some key benefits of a</u> <u>donation of this type from your</u> <u>IRA:</u>

1. Reduce your taxable income: The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security subject to tax.

2. Fulfill your Required

Minimum Distribution: If you are 73 years old or older, your QCD can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Simplicity: The process is straightforward—just instruct your IRA custodian to make the gift directly to Faith Hope. If you would like to ensure your contribution is received in the current tax year, it is best to initiate your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) in early December!
