

# Dismissal

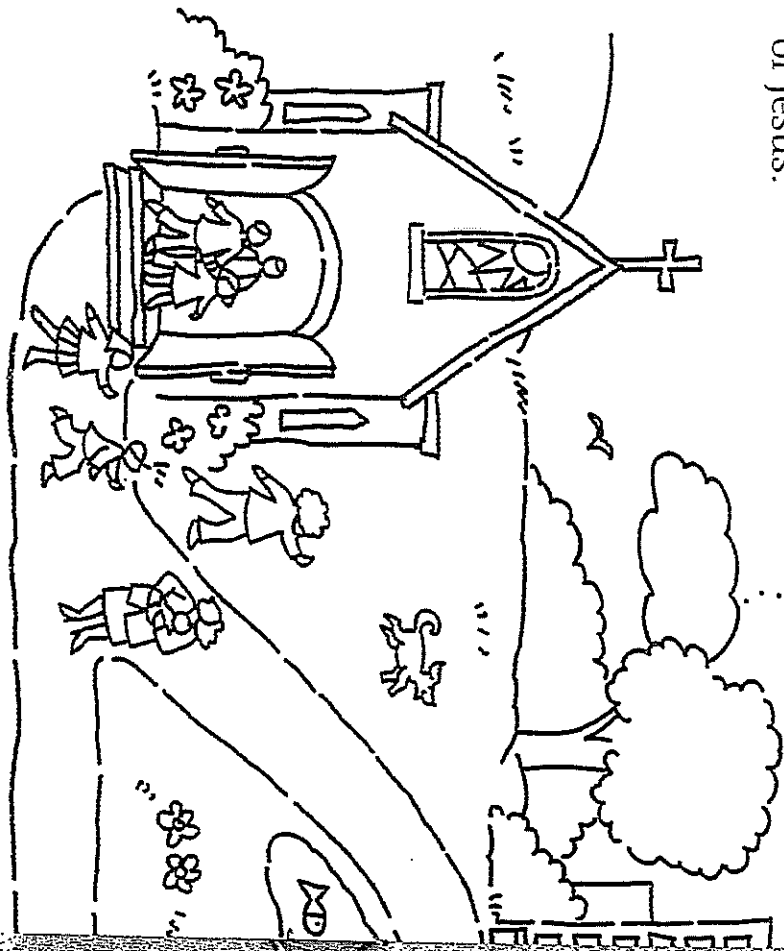
As Mass ends, we are sent to glorify the Lord in our lives at home, at work, and in the world.

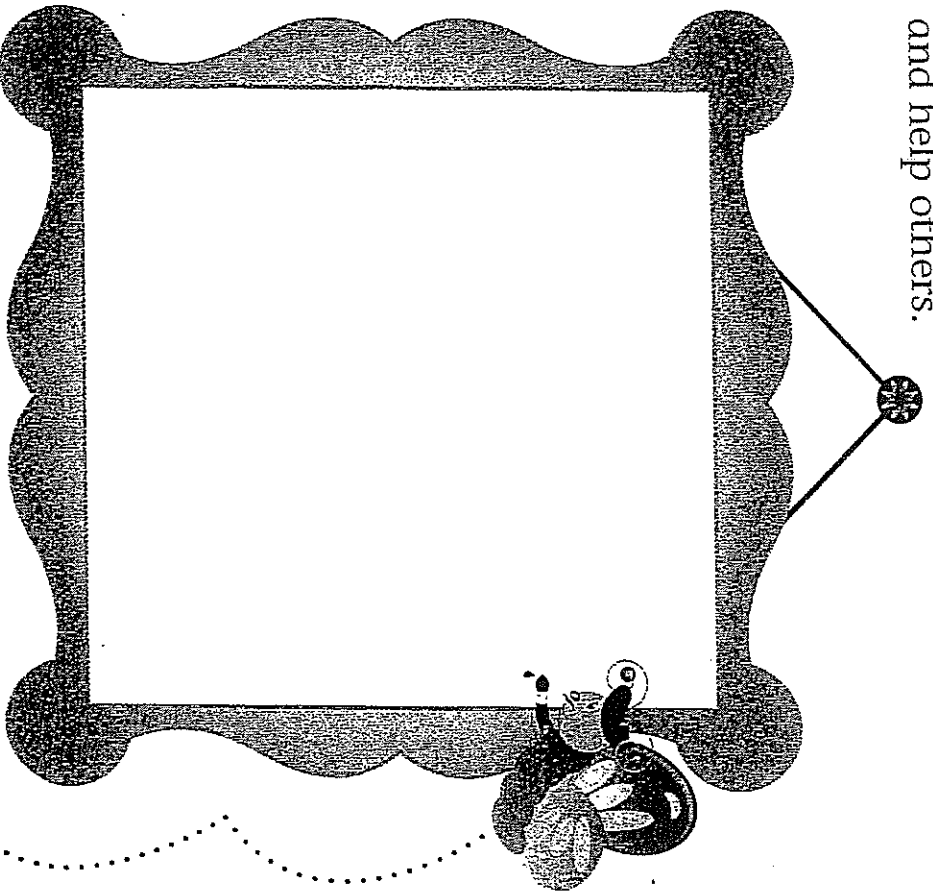

the Eucharist.

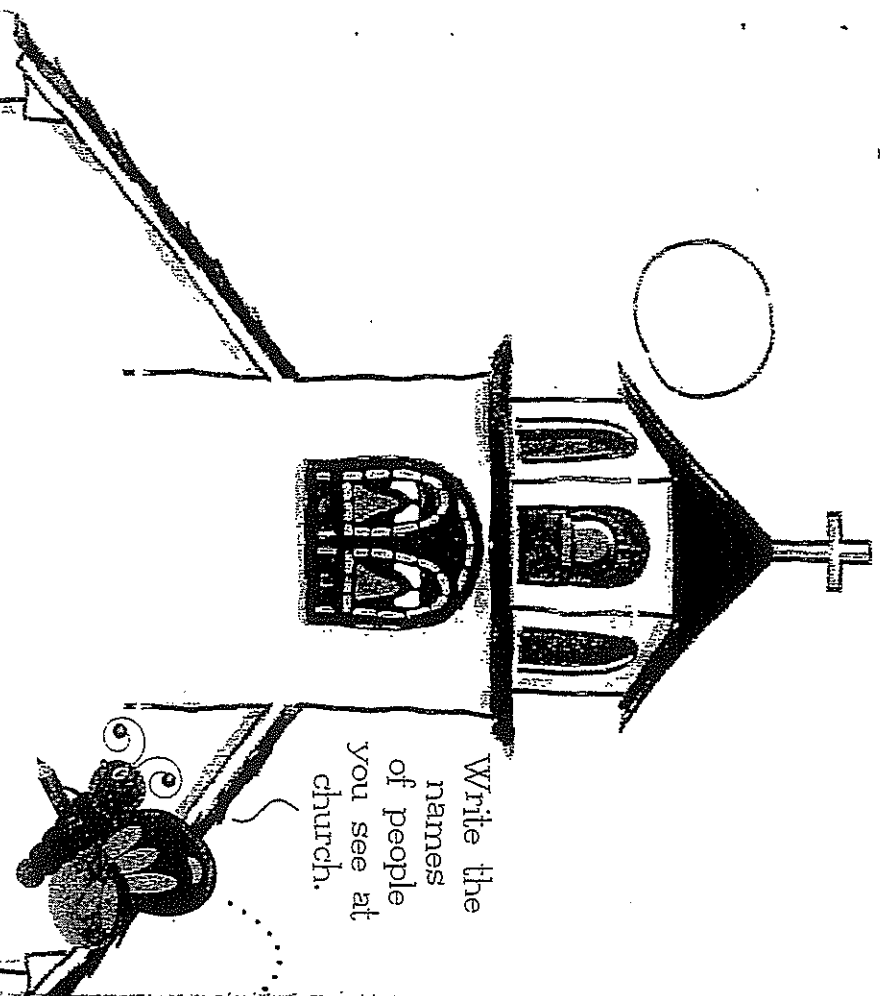


We take some time to pray silently. Then

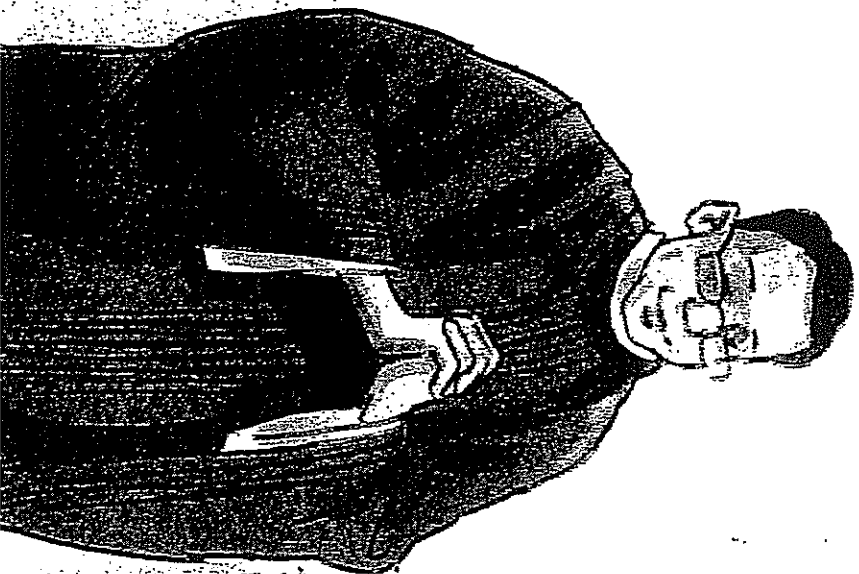
# We Celebrate Mass

## Introductory Rites

We gather in God's presence.

## Entrance Chant

The priest, deacon, ministers, and servers process to the altar. We stand and sing a song praising God.



We receive Holy Communion from a priest, a deacon, or an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion.

We bow in reverence. We receive the Body of Christ—under the form of bread—in our hands or on our tongue.

**Priest:** The Body of Christ.

**People:** Amen.

We bow in reverence. We receive the Blood of Christ under the form of wine.

**Priest:** The Blood of Christ.

**People:** Amen.

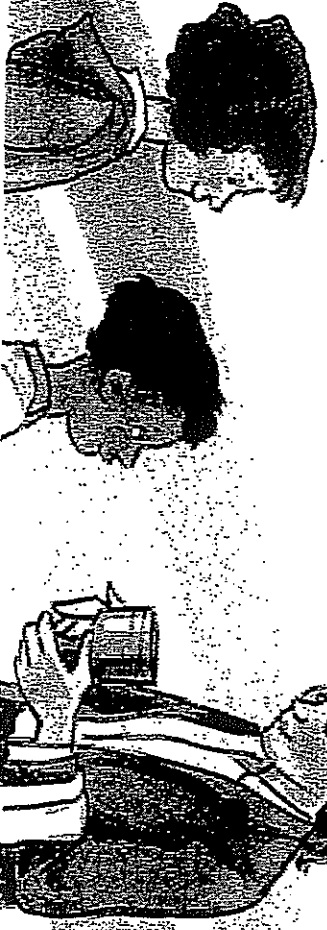


**Duke Communion** we kneel as  
we prepare to receive Holy Communion.  
The priest raises the host and the chalice.  
We pray.

**Priest:** Behold the Lamb of God  
behold him who takes away the  
sins of the world.  
Blessed are those called to the  
supper of the Lamb.

**People:** Lord, I am not worthy  
that you should enter under my  
roof,  
but only say the word  
and my soul shall be healed.

The priest receives Holy Communion.  
Then he offers the Body and Blood  
of Christ to the deacon and the  
extraordinary ministers of Holy  
Communion.



**Greeting**  
The priest greets all who are gathered.

**Priest:** In the name of the Father, and of  
the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**People:** Amen.

**Priest:** The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
and the love of God,  
and the communion of the Holy Spirit  
be with you all.

**People:** And with your spirit.



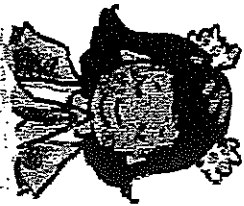
## **Penitential Act**

We admit that we have sinned. We ask God for mercy. We pray together.

*I confess to almighty God  
and to you, my brothers and sisters,  
that I have greatly sinned,  
in my thoughts and in my words,  
in what I have done and in what I have failed  
to do,*

Then, we strike our breast and say:

*through my fault, through my fault,  
through my most grievous fault;  
therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin,  
all the Angels and Saints,  
and you, my brothers and sisters,  
to pray for me to the Lord  
our God.*



*Lord, have mercy.*

The priest breaks the consecrated host.



At this time, we all sing or pray aloud  
the **Lamb of God.**

grant us peace.*

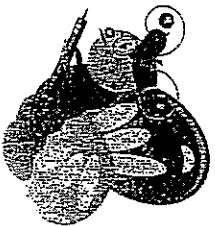
In the **Sign of Peace** the priest prays that we will be united with one another in Christ's peace.

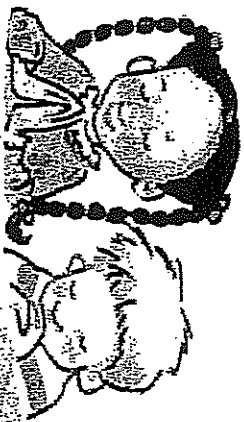

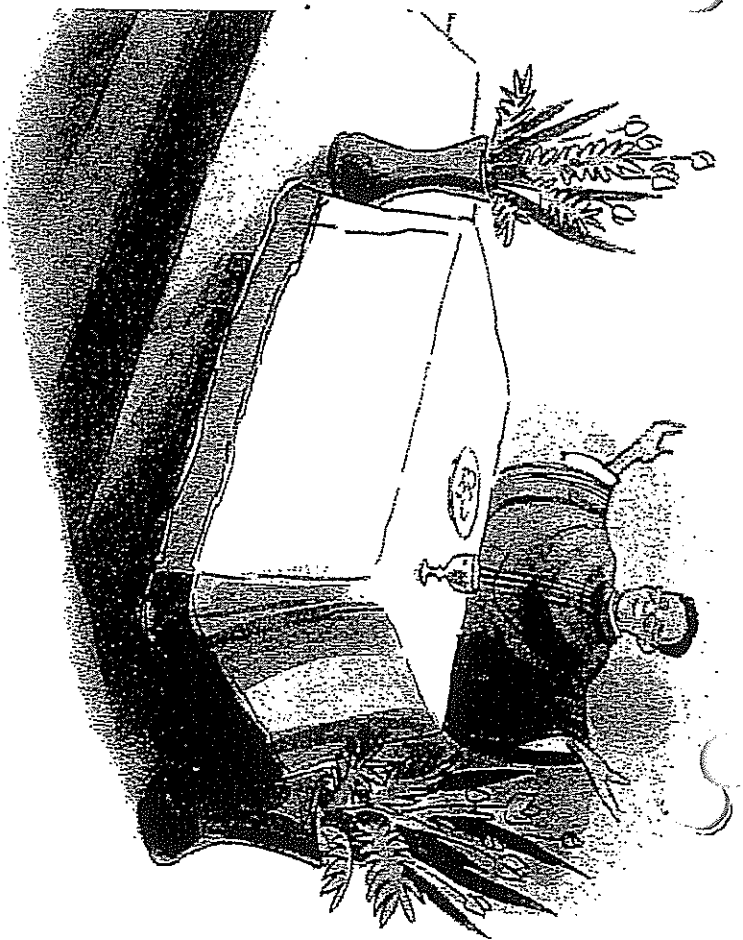
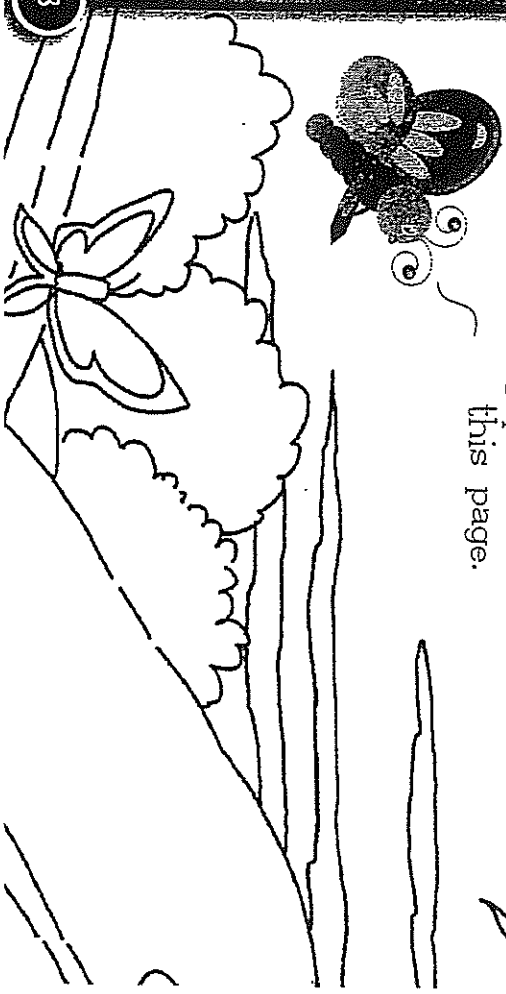

## Liturgy of the Word

We sit and listen to God's Word.

### First Reading

The lector proclaims the first reading. It's usually from the Old Testament. Sometimes it's from the Acts of the Apostles.

We honor God's Word by our response at the end of the reading.

**Lector:** The Word of the Lord.

**People:** Thanks be to God.



We recall all Jesus has done to save us. We proclaim the **Mystery of Faith**.

**Priest:** The mystery of faith:

**People:** We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

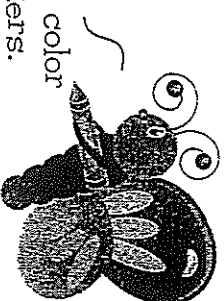
The Eucharistic Prayer ends with the **Concluding Doxology** and an **Amen**.

**Priest:** Through him, and with him, and in him,

O God, almighty Father,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
all glory and honor is yours,  
for ever and ever.

**People:** **Amen.**

We *U* and continue praying the Eucharistic Prayer. We remember Jesus' Last Supper. We remember his sacrifice on the cross. We do as Jesus taught.

The **Consecration** begins. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Through the power of the Holy Spirit and the words and actions of the priest, Christ is present with us.

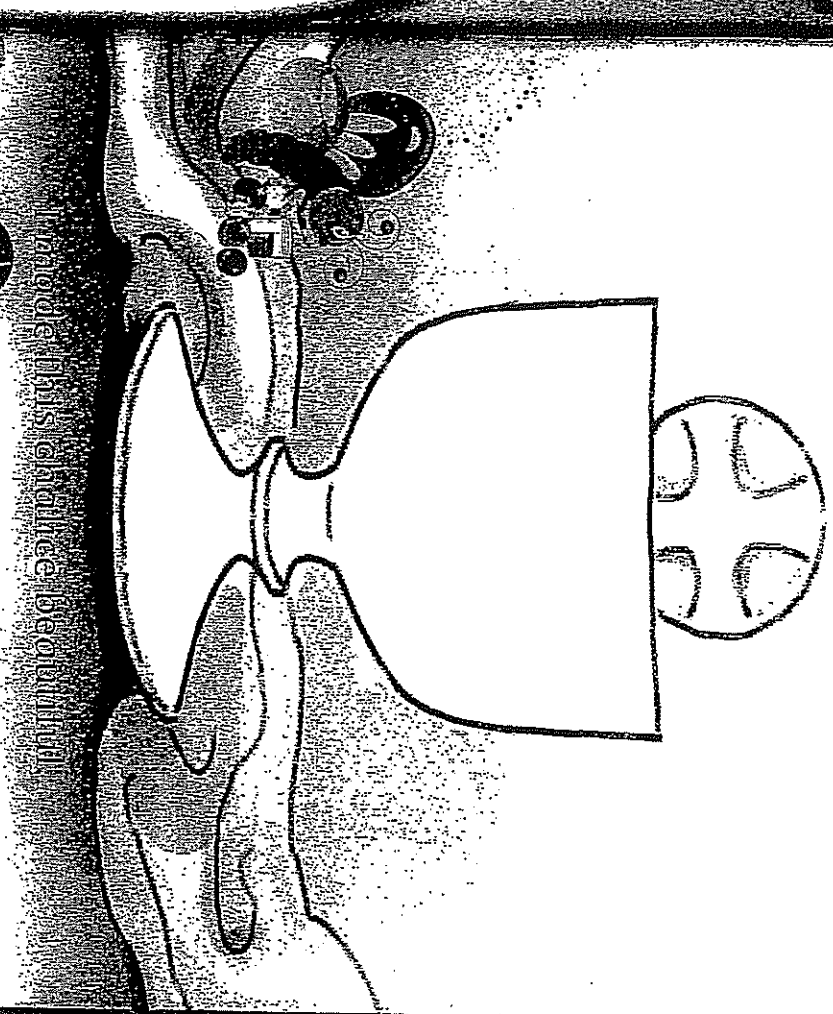

Acclamation, an Alleluia, or other words  
of praise.

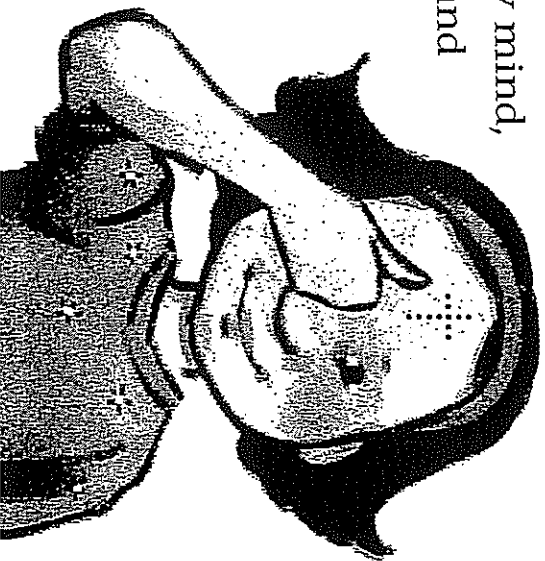
**Priest or deacon:** The Lord be with you.

holy Gospel according to (Matthew,  
Mark, Luke, or John).

**People:** Glory to you, O Lord.

We trace a cross on  
our foreheads, lips,  
and hearts. I pray

The priest continues praying words of  
thanks and praise.

Then all sing or pray the **HOLY, HOLY,  
HOLY.**

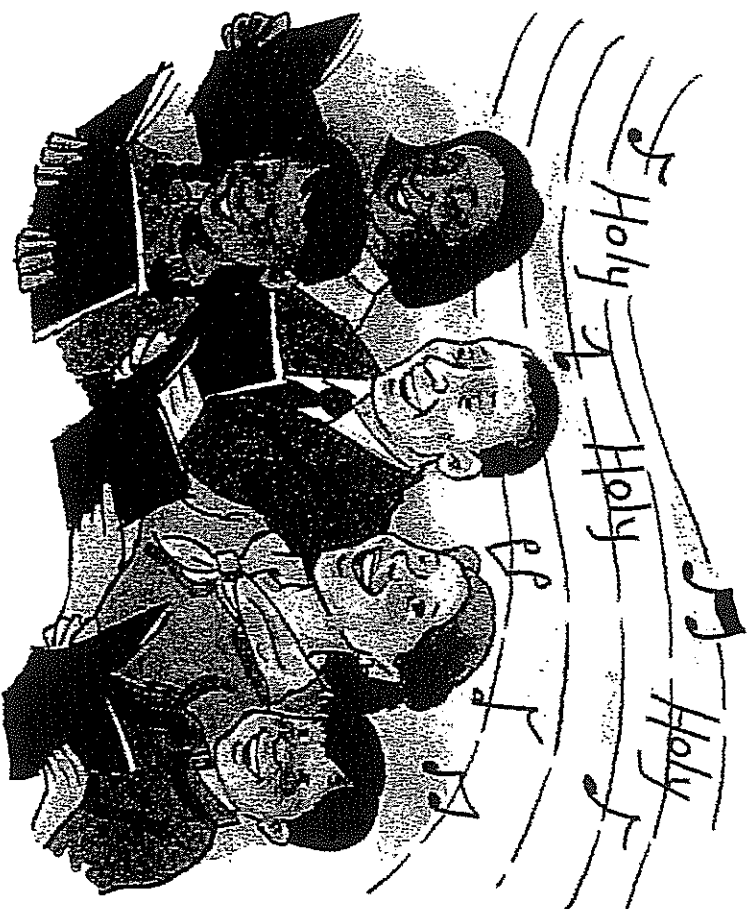

**People:** And with your spirit.

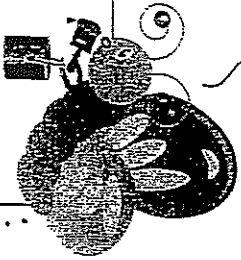
**Priest:** Lift up your hearts.

**Priest or deacon:** The Gospel of the Lord.

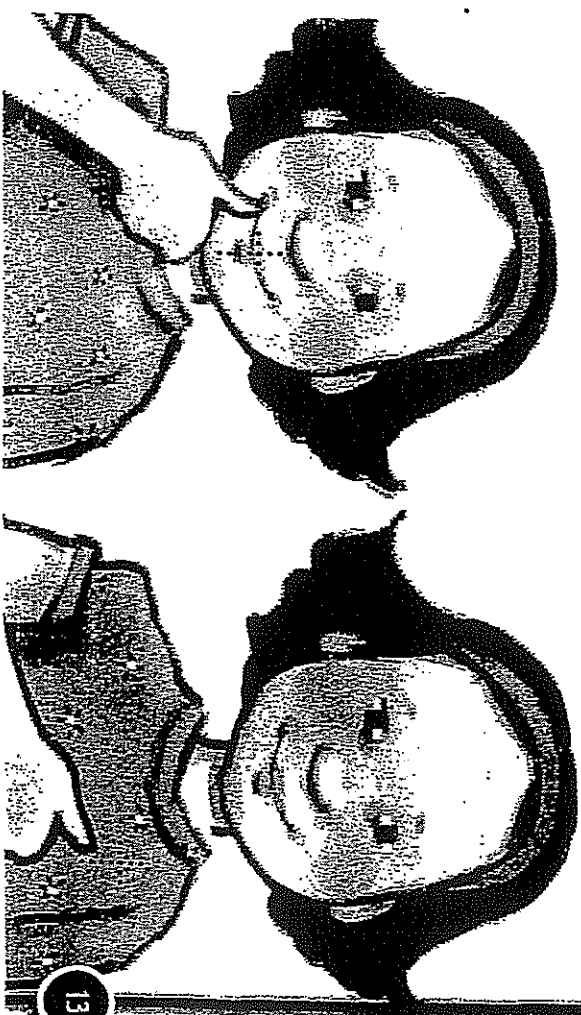
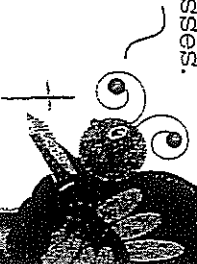
We respond:

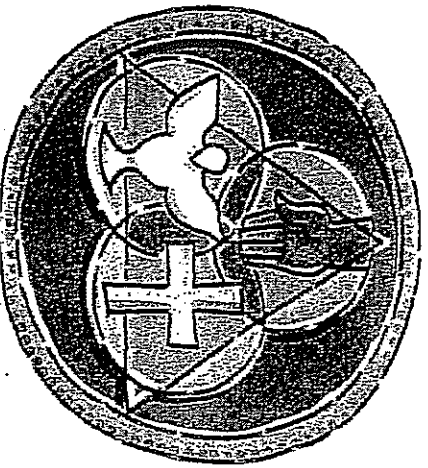


## Profession of Faith

We stand and pray the Creed.

*I believe in one God,  
the Father almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all things visible and invisible.*

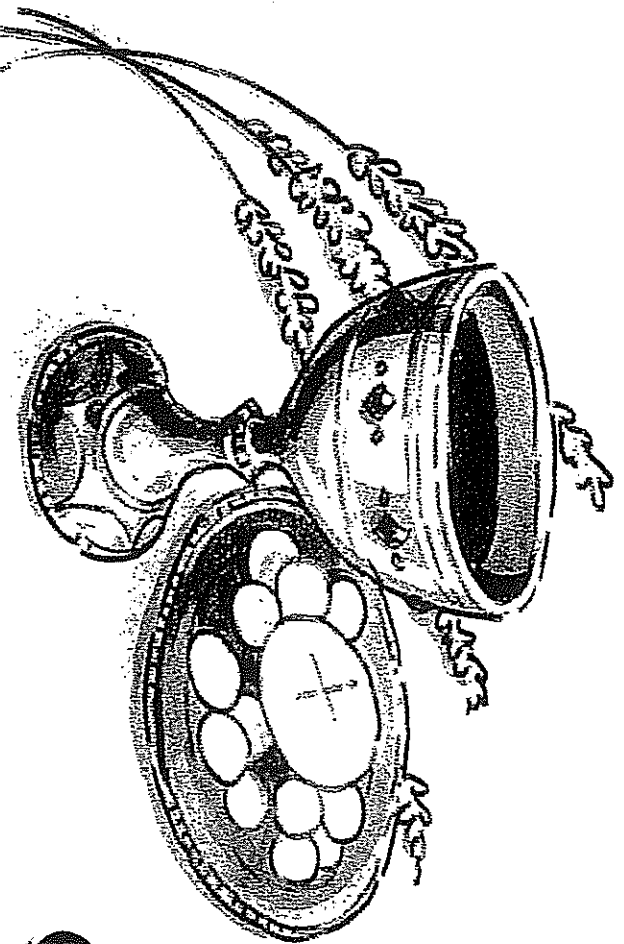
*I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,

God from God, Light from Light,

Virgin Mary,  
and became man.*



We stand as the priest prays over  
the gifts. He asks that God will accept  
our sacrifice.

**Priest:** Pray, brothers and sisters,

may be acceptable to God,  
the almighty Father.

**People:** May the Lord accept the  
sacrifice at your hands  
for the praise and glory  
of his name,  
and the good of all his holy  
Church.



We God to accept and bless our gifts.  
The priest holds up the bread and prays.

**Priest:** Blessed are you, Lord God of  
all creation,  
for through your goodness  
we have received  
the bread we offer you:  
fruit of the earth and work of  
human hands,  
it will become for us the  
bread of life.

**People:** Blessed be God for ever.

Then he raises the wine and prays.

**Priest:** Blessed are you, Lord God of  
all creation,  
for through your goodness  
we have received  
the wine we offer you:  
fruit of the vine and work of  
human hands,  
it will become our spiritual drink.

**People:** Blessed be God for ever.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius  
Pilate,  
he suffered death and was buried,  
and rose again on the third day  
in accordance with the Scriptures.  
He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver  
of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is adored and  
glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic  
Church.  
I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness  
of sins  
and I look forward to the resurrection  
of the dead  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

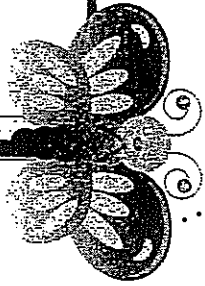
