



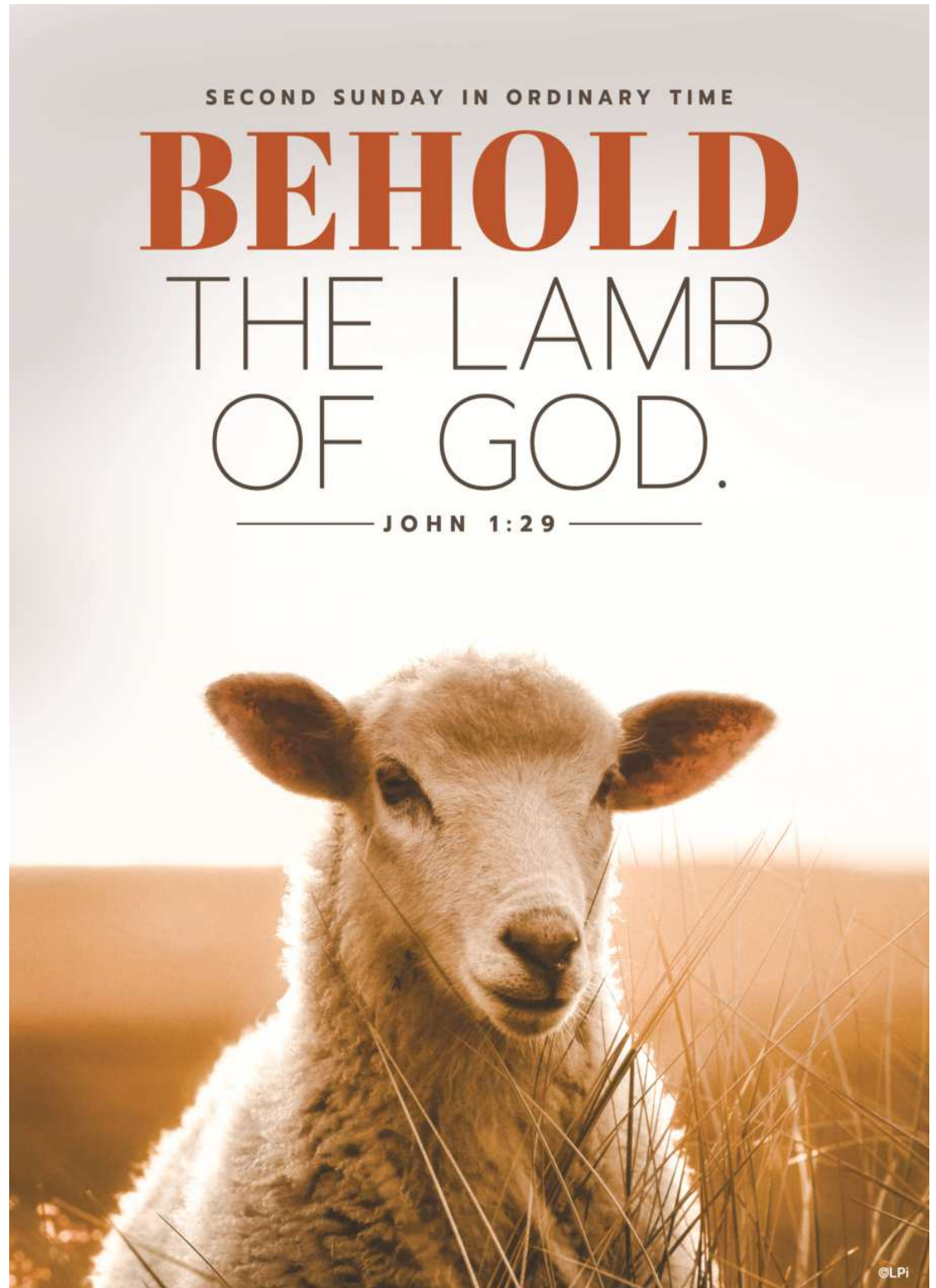

A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Please scan the QR Code to sign up for **FOOD DONATIONS**.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time **BEFORE** the **WEDNESDAY** preceding the **SECOND THURSDAY** of the month.

PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin **ON THAT WEDNESDAY** **BY 7:30am** to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to **SERVE** the FHC lunch on that **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer.

The next donation date is **WEDNESDAY, February 11**, for the lunch that will be served on **THURSDAY, February 12**.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of **NON-PERISHABLES** are always welcome and may be put in the Bell Tower bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.

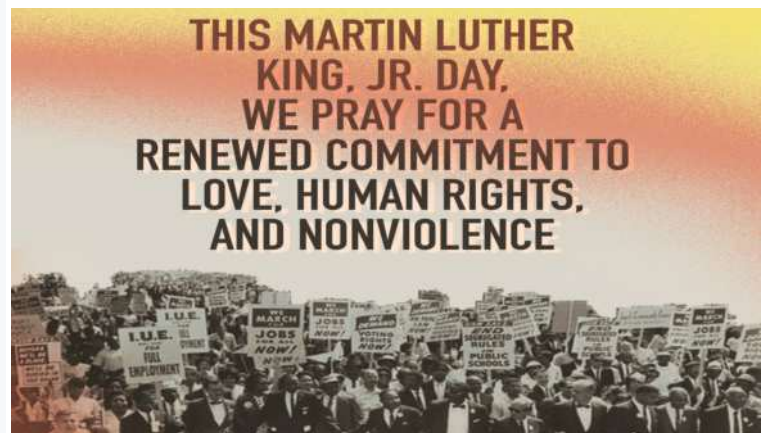

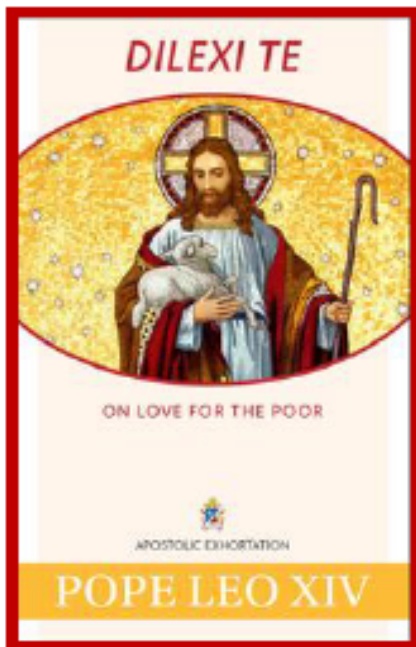

"Fr. Matt is pastor of St. Gall & Chapel St. Simon in Chicago's Gage Park neighborhood. Ordained in 1989, Fr. Matt served St. Agatha in North Lawndale, before becoming pastor of Santiago Apostol in Guerrero, Mexico, serving 26 mountain villages. In 2000, he returned to Chicago, as pastor of St. Agnes of Bohemia in Little Village, with 9 Sunday Masses and 6,100 Sunday worshippers. Fr. Matt felt called to accompany US personnel in the Middle East. As a US Army Chaplain, Fr. Matt deployed to Afghanistan four times, serving with the 82nd Airborne, 101st Airborne and US Army Special Operations divisions. Following 5+ years in the Army, Fr. Matt became pastor of St. James Parish in Arlington Heights, while also administering Mission Juan Diego for a time."

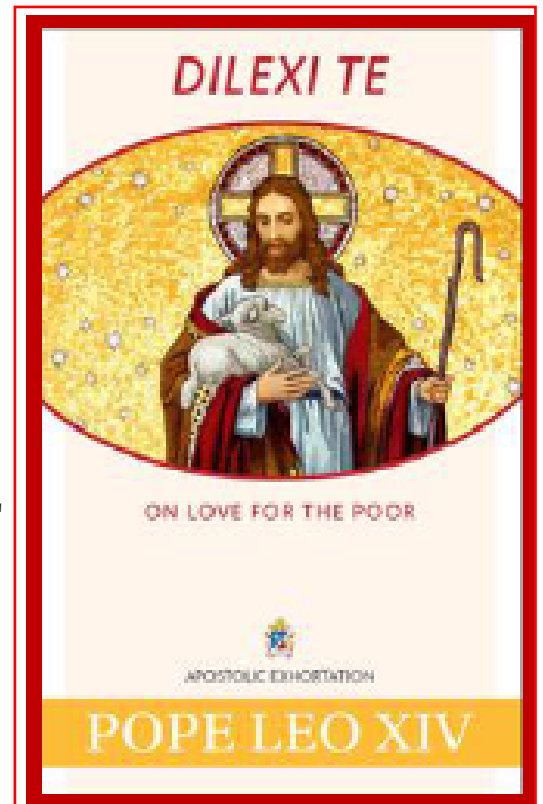
Series - Pope Leo's *Dilexi Te* (On Love for the Poor)

What is the Church's "preferential option for the poor"?

The **preferential option for the poor**, is one of the newer principles of Catholic social teaching, coming from the latter half of the 20th century. It refers to biblical statements of **preference being given to the well-being of the poor and powerless of society in the teachings and commands of God**. Jesus taught that on the Day of Judgement, God will ask what each person did to help the poor and needy. This is reflected in Catholic canon law, which states, "[The Christian Faithful] are also obliged to promote social justice and, mindful of the precept of the Lord, to assist the poor from their own resources."

The doctrine implies that **the moral test of any society is "how it treats its most vulnerable members. The poor have the most urgent moral claim on the conscience of the nation. We are called to look at public policy decisions in terms of how they affect the poor"**.

Pope Benedict XVI has taught that "love for widows and orphans, prisoners, and the sick and needy of every kind, is as essential as the ministry of the sacraments and preaching of the Gospel". **This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized in society, including unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, and victims of injustice and oppression.** Pope Leo's first apostolic exhortation, *Dilexi Te* (On Love for the Poor) is focused on this aspect of our faith.



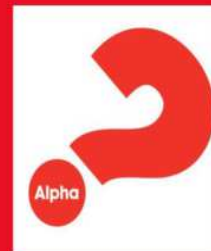
