





A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Please scan the QR Code to sign up for **FOOD DONATIONS**.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time **BEFORE** the **WEDNESDAY** preceding the **SECOND THURSDAY** of the month.

PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin **ON THAT WEDNESDAY** **BY 7:30am** to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to **SERVE** the FHC lunch on that **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from **11:15 to 2:30** to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served **12-2**. Each server is asked to bring **2-3 gallons** of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer.

The next donation date is **WEDNESDAY, March 11**, for the lunch that will be served on **THURSDAY, March 12**.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of **NON-PERISHABLES** are always welcome and may be put in the Bell Tower bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.

Saints Faith, Hope & Charity is beginning an important new chapter with the launch of **Forward in Faith: Campus Master Plan**—a comprehensive master planning process focused on the long-term future of our campus facilities and grounds.

Over the next several months, this effort will bring together parishioners, school families, staff, ministry leaders, and neighbors to thoughtfully explore how our campus can better support worship, learning, gathering, and community life for years to come. The plan will evaluate existing buildings and outdoor spaces, identify opportunities for improvement, create a clear, phased roadmap to guide strategic reinvestment over the next decade, and ultimately inform a capital campaign as part of the Archdiocese of Chicago's Generation to Generation – Answer the Call campaign.

This is not simply a facilities study. It is a community-driven visioning process grounded in the needs, experiences, and hopes of the FHC community. Your voice is essential.

We are just beginning this journey, and there will be many opportunities to participate along the way, from surveys and workshops to small group conversations and community events. Early input will help shape the direction of the plan and ensure it reflects the values and priorities of those who use and love this campus every day.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.



Aid for Women was founded in 1978 on the faith and teachings of the Catholic Church. Aid for Women helps thousands of women each year in the Chicago metropolitan area who find themselves facing unexpected pregnancies. Each woman is provided with the emotional, practical and spiritual support that she needs to choose life for her unborn baby and to provide a better future for herself and her child. Aid for Women currently operates five Pregnancy Care Centers, as well as two Maternity Homes (Heather's House and Monica's House).



About Faith Hope & Carpenters

Faith Hope and Carpenters (FHC) is our Parish volunteer team that works with Rebuilding Together North Suburban Chicago, to restore and rehab homes for needy families with children, the elderly, those with disabilities and veterans who live in the northern suburbs and have few resources to make the needed repairs to their homes. FHC has been providing this service for over 19 years. The 2025 project was to help a senior citizen de-clutter, organize and clean both the interior and exterior of her home. Over thirty volunteers from FHC and a dozen students from Loyola Academy participated in this project. The volunteers made significant improvements to the home and helped the homeowner improve her quality of life. Stay tuned for details on this year's project. We are ever grateful for your care and support!



About FHC Food Sharing Program

The **FHC Food Sharing Program** helps to support several food pantries and soup kitchens in the Chicagoland area. The food distribution from these pantries serves over 15,000 families and individuals every year! In addition, there is also a mobile food pantry that brings the available food items out to various locations for pickup a couple times per month. The Soup Kitchens provide meals at several kitchens that benefit from our Food Sharing program, but essentially dinner is served 7-days per week, and each location providing meals can serve anywhere from 95 to 200 people per evening! 


