



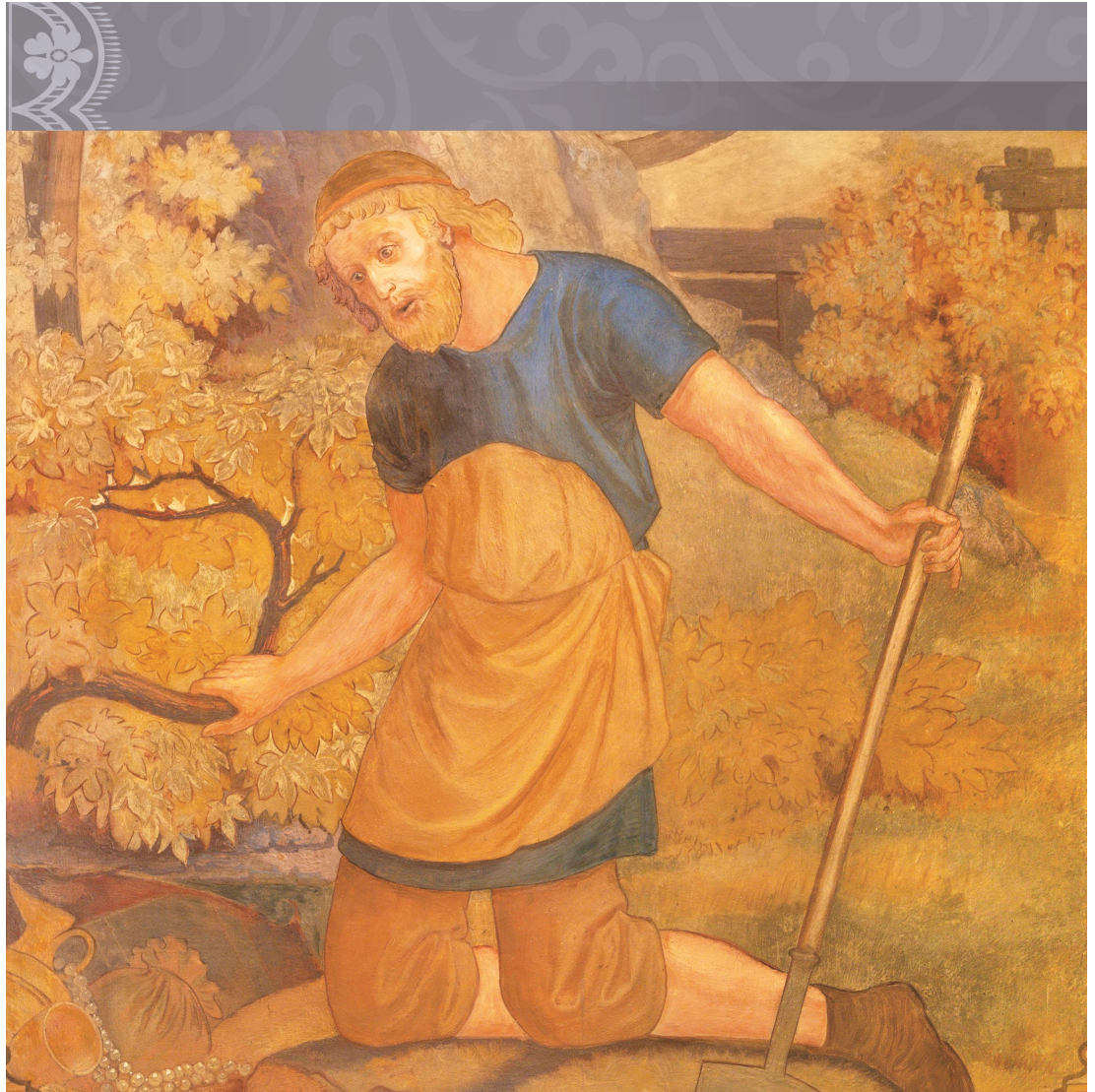

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A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Please use the SignUp below to sign up for **FOOD DONATIONS**.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the **AJH bin in the back of church** (open daily 7a-12p) any time **BEFORE** the **WEDNESDAY** preceding the **SECOND THURSDAY** of the month. **PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin ON THAT WEDNESDAY BY 7:30am** to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to **SERVE** the FHC lunch on that **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. **Servers should wear closed-toe shoes and slacks or jeans (no shorts or skirts please)**. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer to serve.

The next donation date is **WEDNESDAY, August 12**, for the lunch that will be served on **THURSDAY, August 13**.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of NON-PERISHABLES are always welcome and may be put in the bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.

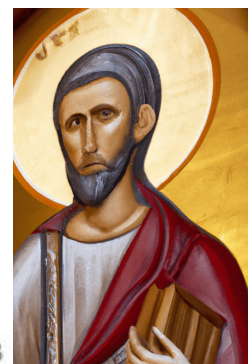
HOW SAINT DISMAS MADE IT TO WINNETKA

The background story was told to me by a parishioner at St. Athanasius parish in Evanston about 30 years ago. I used to attend the monthly meetings of the St. Vincent De Paul Society, which was a kind of precursor to Sharing Committees, which assisted all sorts of people in need. After the meetings, these senior citizens often shared stories from the old days. The one about St. Dismas came from John O'Keefe, the group's leader, a humble man with a fascinating background. He had been the personal secretary of Samuel Insull, the Chicago multi-millionaire whose financial empire crumbled during the great Depression. John later served as assistant to Frank Knox, the Secretary of the Navy at the start of World War II. After that John became the publisher of the Chicago Daily News, the prestigious afternoon newspaper which eventually folded when television evening newscasts displaced them. So here's John's story.

One of his colleagues at the Daily News was a man named Dempster McMurphy, who loved St. Dismas. Like so many others, Dempster lost his fortune in the stock market crash of 1929. The story of the good thief in chapter 23 of St. Luke's Gospel gave him hope in this time of personal disaster, because Dismas was able to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat, and that's exactly what he needed to do. Hanging in shame on the cross next to Jesus on Calvary, Dismas cried out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." The Lord replied with those words we all long to hear someday, "This day you will be with me in paradise." Thus inspired, Dempster picked up the pieces of his own life, and reinvented himself as a newsman. Moreover, he became a great booster of St. Dismas to others who were down on their luck. In fact, each year during Holy week the Daily News would reprint a beautiful story which Dempster McMurphy wrote about his friend, Dismas. That eventually led to the making of a Hollywood movie titled "The Hoodlum Saint" in 1946.

When Dempster McMurphy died, a group of his friends including John O'Keefe and Tom Dean (an elderly Faith Hope parishioner who told me the same story years later) wanted to do something special in his memory. At that time Monsignor Burke was planning the new church building, so they suggested a statue and shrine to St. Dismas. Some objected, saying that the only statues of Dismas were located in prison chapels, not in affluent suburban churches. However, the friends convinced Monsignor that one of the facts of life in a place like Winnetka, the land of the winners, is that disaster can strike folks in all kinds of ways – a financial reversal, a debilitating injury or illness, an addiction that overwhelms them, relationships that disintegrate, and many other grim possibilities. At such times, what better sign of hope could one have than St. Dismas?

And so there he stands today, the giver of hope, amid all the glitter and gold of the sanctuary of Saints Faith Hope and Charity Church. One hopes that his friend Dempster McMurphy, wherever he is, may be smiling.

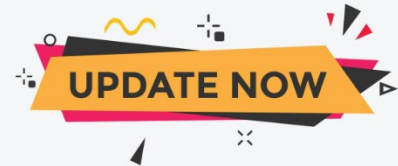

School Boiler Replacement Project — This Summer

We are pleased to share that this summer we will be replacing all three boilers that heat the school and pre-school — a significant and necessary investment in our facilities.



Of our three existing units, one has been out of service for more than a year, and the remaining two have exceeded their lifespan. Replacing all three at once allows us to restore full heating capacity to the school while avoiding the higher costs of staggered replacements down the road.

Work is expected to take place over the summer months, and we anticipate minimal disruption to normal parish activities. However, please be aware that a small number of parking spaces near the gym may be temporarily unavailable during portions of the project. We appreciate your patience and flexibility.

More details will be shared as the project gets underway.

The one-time training is conveniently-scheduled, and you may choose your Mass and frequency of service.

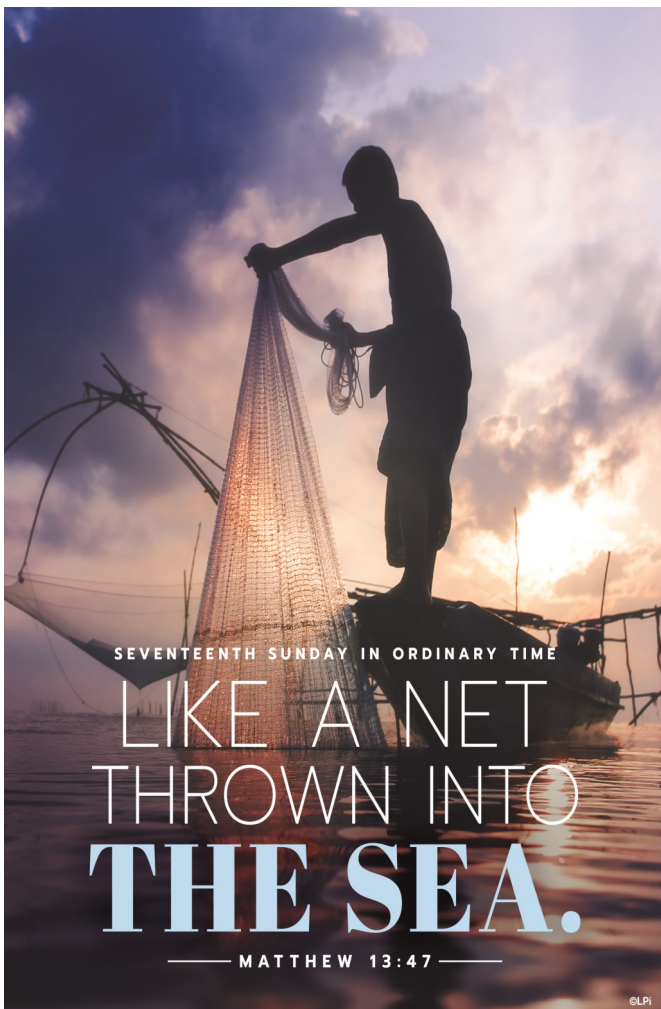

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Around the time that the gold rushes ended in the nineteenth-century West, a curious phenomenon arose in New England known as money diggers. These were men who roamed the countryside with shovels, divining rods, and superstitious hope, convinced that treasure lay buried beneath their feet. Surely there must be gold under our feet. But there was not. The craze of these wild goose chases caused many to lose farms, families, and sanity.

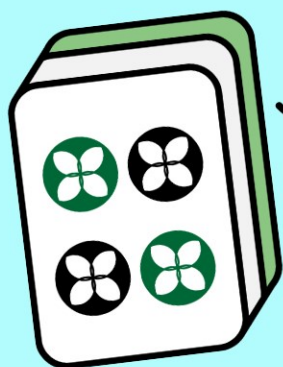
In this week's Gospel, Jesus inaugurates a new era of spiritual money digging. He announces, “The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field.” He invites us to become treasure seekers who search in the right place. What is of greatest value is not money beneath our feet, but the infinite treasure hidden deep in the humanity of Jesus himself, God's own blessed life. The glory of heaven lies veiled in his ordinary life, his teaching, his suffering, his Church.

This teaching about the Kingdom changes things. Now we see the Church's doctrinal and moral teachings are not arbitrary rules. They are a treasure map. Follow them, and we will uncover divine happiness. Ignore them, and we will wander aimlessly, spade in hand, digging in empty fields, discouraged.

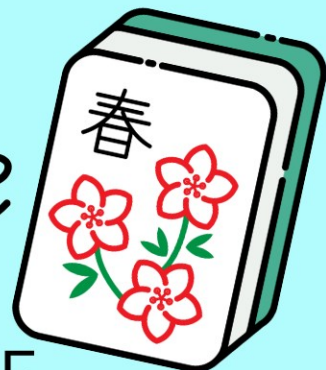
Where have we wasted energy seeking treasure in the wrong places? How have we given up on seeking the treasure of truly finding God's love for us? If so, let us repent of both. Then let us dust off our shovels and get back to digging deep into the field of Christ Jesus and his Church. After all, He never ceases seeking his treasure in us.

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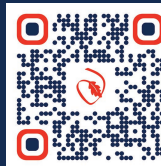
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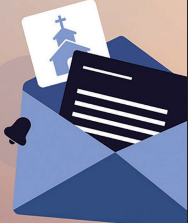
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
